## Progression Plan for 2018 Commencing Students

Terminology	Definition
<b>Program compulsory core courses and INFS elective courses</b>	90UOC of compulsory courses and choose 6UOC of INFS stage 2/3 elective which students must complete under this degree.
<b>Industry Placement courses</b>	These courses account for 36 UOC. Students complete 3 industrial training experience courses within the area of their co-op scholarship, with each course worth 12 UOC.
<b>Honours courses</b>	<p>48 UOC of 4th year and honours courses, including a 24 UOC thesis. To be eligible to enrol in level 4 INFS courses and the thesis component, a student must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Have a WAM of at least 70 in Information Systems courses.</li> <li>• Pass all courses at the first attempt.</li> </ul> <p>Students not meeting the above eligibility requirements to enrol in level 4 INFS courses and/or the thesis component will be transferred to the BIS (3979) degree program. The thesis will be marked by two independent markers. In line with the Business School Honours Protocol the honours supervisor will not be one of the markers.</p>
<b>General Education</b>	<p>Account for 12UOC (2 courses) and are to be taken outside the UNSW Business School. Please note that students enrolled in programs within the UNSW Business School cannot take General Education courses offered by the UNSW Business School (i.e. GENC code).
